



A Note from Adult Protective Services

SENIORS PLEASE BE AWARE Scammers continue to target you!!

Your telephone, computer, email, and snail mail are all gateways to your money and personal information.

Seniors in the Kenai Peninsula continue to fall prey to scammers leaving them financially destitute and emotionally scarred. Please do not give out your personal information, send money or gift cards to anyone.

NO ONE NEEDS YOUR MONEY MORE THAN YOU!

- If you are struggling, bored or lonely and need someone to chat with, choose someone you know to confide in verses a stranger on a dating site, common interests or Facebook chatrooms.
- A random text message is NOT random, this is how scammers test to see who will respond. Delete immediately.
- 3. Please DO NOT click on email links you do not know. This is how your computer will get a virus and scammers obtain personal information. The most common email scam is notifying you that your computer has been compromised and need to pay to have it fixed or click on a link to fix.

- AGAIN, DO NOT CLICK ON LINKS. DO NOT believe any email that elicits fear in you. Delete immediately.
- 4. Scammers pull on your emotions and groom you as they go possibly asking you to marry them. It is a SCAM. After they have lured you into their emotional hold, they will ask to borrow money or have an elaborate story of an emergent need for your financial help. Some will even ask you to hold money for them but DO NOT! You could be pulled into a money laundering scam and not know it. If you find yourself in this situation, please do not be embarrassed. The first step is to STOP all communications with the scammer and report it immediately to Adult Protective Service by calling (907) 269-3666 and ask to speak to The Centralized Intake Unit. You may also go online to www.dhss.alaska.gov/ dsds and click on "Report Here" button.
